

Trocaire College and Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) Articulation Agreement

Overview

Under this agreement, Trocaire College will provide to qualified Erie2 Chautauqua-Cattaraugus Board of Cooperative Educational Services (herein forward referred to as E2CC-BOCES) students who successfully complete the Animal Science program the opportunity to receive advanced credit towards the Trocaire College's Veterinary Technician Program (A.A.S.).

Upon successful completion of the E2CC-BOCES Animal Science program with an 85% or greater, and have met the Veterinary Technician program admissions eligibility criteria, students will be eligible to sit for a VET100 challenge exam. Successful completion of this exam with a score of 73% or greater will result in the award of three (3) college level credits in the VT100 course. In addition, student who successfully complete the animal experience component of the E2CC-BOCES Animal Science program will be waived from the forty (40) hour animal experience required in the first semester of the Veterinary Technician degree program.

Veterinary Technician Program Admission Requirements:

Trocaire College evaluates students based on academic metrics, experience, and personal attributes, which include:

- High School Diploma (minimum 75% average) or GED Diploma with a minimum score of 2500
- Official transcripts from high school and all colleges attended

Pre-entry Requirements

- Final grade of 85 or higher in Biology or Chemistry (high school or college level)
- Must meet the minimal technical standards and physical requirements of the veterinary technology profession
- Must provide proof of rabies pre-exposure vaccination series and a current tetanus inoculation prior to beginning the program

- 10. Evidence mastery with minimum passing grade of 73% or greater on the VET100 challenge exam.

General Provisions

Term and Termination of Agreement. The term of the Agreement shall be effective September 1, 2024 and be in effect until either party wishes to terminate the Agreement by written notification signed by the appropriate official of the party initiating the termination. Such notification must be received by the other party at least six months prior to the effective termination date.

Supersedes Prior Agreements. This Agreement shall supersede and replace all prior agreements and understandings, oral or written, between Trocaire College and E2CC-**BOCES Animal Science Programs.**

Amendment of Agreement. This Agreement may be amended at any time by the written agreement of both parties. Any amendments to this Agreement shall be in writing and approved in the same manner as was used to approve this Agreement.

Indemnification

- A. To the extent permitted by law, E2CC-BOCES, defend, and hold harmless Trocaire College, its agents and employees, from any claims, demands, or causes of action arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of E2CC-BOCES, its agents or employees, in the performance of E2CC-BOCES' obligations under this agreement.
- B. To the extent permitted by law, Trocaire College shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless E2CC-BOCES, its agents and employees, from any claims, demands, or causes of action arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of Trocaire College, its agents or employees, in the performance of Trocaire College obligations under this agreement.
