

Nursing: Practical Nursing (LPN)

Certificate

The Practical Nursing (LPN) program is the only college credit-bearing Practical Nursing Program in Erie County. Graduates are able to provide clinically competent patient care in addition to case finding, health teaching, and health counseling. A LPN works with, and functions successfully under, the supervision of a Registered Nurse (RN) within a health care setting. As a member of the healthcare delivery team, the LPN provides supportive and restorative care.

Class Schedule

The program's coursework is offered during the day and students can begin the program core in the fall or spring semester. Students participate in clinical experiences twice a week, in addition to their classes and lab days. Clinical sites change each semester and students must have the CPR certificate completed prior to beginning clinical experiences.

Admission Requirements

First-time college students

- High School Diploma, minimum of a 75% GPA, or GED Diploma, minimum score of 2500
- Math competency determined by Admissions Office
- Biology/Living Environment (75% or "C" grade required)

Transfer Students

- 2.50 minimum cumulative college GPA
- Math competency determined by Admissions Office
- Biology/Living Environment (75% or "C" grade required)

All Students

Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certificate is required prior to clinical experience.*

*American Health Association CPR— Health Care provider course is required of all students in the nursing program (online courses are not accepted). NYSED Office of Professions states, under the Professional Nurse Obligations, NYSED does not permit online CPR courses. Students must attend an NYSED Office of Professional Approved CPR course through the American Heart Association.

*A student CPR card should not expire during the length of the clinical portion of the program. If it is due to expire during the program, students will be required to recertify prior to beginning the clinical portion of the nursing program.

Trocaire College offers the course: "CPR/BLS for Healthcare Providers". This course satisfies the requirement for CPR certification.
