

Program Effectiveness Data:

Credentialing Exam Rate

Report of the number of students who attempted the ARRT exam and passed on the 1st attempt out of the total number of graduates who attempted the ARRT exam.

2013	90%	28 of 31 students passed on 1 st attempt
2014	100%	30 of 30 students passed on 1 st attempt
2015	97%	34 of 35 students passed on 1 st attempt
2016	97%	32 of 33 students passed on 1 st attempt
2017	100%	28 of 28 students passed on 1 st attempt
5-Year Average	97%	152 of 157 students passed on 1 st attempt

Job Placement

The five-year average for the job placement rate should not be below 75% within 12 months after graduation. Per JRCERT guideline for Standard Five – Objective 5.2 the JRCERT defines those graduates as “not actively seeking employment” as:

1. Graduate fails to communicate with program officials regarding employment status after multiple attempts **OR**
2. Graduate is unwilling to seek employment that requires relocation, **OR**
3. Graduate is unwilling to accept employment due to salary or hours, **OR**
4. Graduate is on active military duty, **OR**
5. Graduate is continuing education.

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Calendar Year	Percent Job Placement	Number of Students
2013	93%	25 of 27 graduates are working in the field. The other 4 graduates are either continuing their education or did not respond after multiple attempts.
2014	80%	20 of 25 graduates are working in the field. The other 5 graduates are either continuing their education or did not respond after multiple attempts.
2015	84%	27 of 32 graduates are working in the field. The other 3 graduates are either continuing their education or did not respond after multiple attempts.
2016	76%	25 of 33 graduates are working in the field. All graduates are either working in the field or seeking employment in the field.
2017	87%	13 of 15 graduates were working with 2 students actively looking. The other 13 are either continuing their education or did not respond after multiple attempts.
5-Year Average	83%	110 of 132 graduates are working in the field.

Program Completion Rate

Per JRCERT guidelines: “Annual Program Completion Rate (PCR) – is defined as the number of students who complete the program within 150% of the stated program length compared to the number of students who initially started with the cohort”.

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Calendar Year	Completion	Number of Students
2013	86%	31 of 36 students graduated from the program
2014	84%	32 of 38 students graduated from the program
2015	81%	35 of 43 students graduated from the program
2016	84%	33 of 39 students graduated from the program
2017	74%	28 of 38 students graduated from the program
5-Year Average	82%	159 of 194 students graduated from the program
